## JOSHUA *Answer key*

1. Joshua was the son of Nun (Exodus 33).
2. From the time of his youth, Josuha had been an aide to Moses (Numbers 11).

6. Most of the spies said the Israelites should not enter the Promised Land, because the people there were so big and powerful that the spies felt like grasshoppers (Numbers 13).
7. Two of the spies, Joshua and Caleb, said the Israelites should enter the Promised Land and take it over, just as God had told them to (Numbers 13-14).

20. When Joshua divided up the land among the tribes of Israel, he gave Caleb the town of Hebron (Joshua 14).
21. The Israelites set up the Tent of Meeting, or the tabernacle, at a place called Shiloh, which became the nation's center for worship (Joshua 18).
22. Joshua died at the age of 110, and he was buried in the Promised Land (Joshua 24).
